

The Enforcement Division of the Fair Political Practices Commission has received a sworn complaint against you. It appears the complainant is alleging you have violated the Political Reform Act's¹ advertisement disclaimer provisions. Dear Ms. West:

I write to make a sworn complaint against Santa Clara County Supervisor Dave Cortese and his candidate controlled campaign committee, Dave Cortese for Senate 2020, FPPC ID No. 1403576. Mr. Cortese has severely abused his public office by using Santa Clara County resources for his campaign. He has used not only County staff time for campaign purposes, but also given away County property at his campaign rallies. He has also used his County e-mail and phone number on campaign communications. He has also repeatedly failed to provide the legally required disclosure on e-mail campaign communications. I request the FPPC move swiftly to stop these illegal actions from continuing to occur.

Facts

Dave Cortese is a Santa Clara County Supervisor. Additionally, he is a candidate for State Senate District 15 in the March 2020 primary election. His candidate controlled campaign committee is Dave Cortese for Senate 2020. The committee ID number for this committee is 1403576.

As a County Supervisor, Cortese has used both physical and electronic County resources in direct support of his campaign. As detailed in Attachment A, Cortese has used County funds under his control to sponsor a "Rose, White and Blue Parade." This event was not held within his Supervisorial district, but was within the boundaries of State Senate District 15. In this County funded parade, Cortese rode in a vehicle emblazoned with his campaign banners and had individuals (some of whom may have been County staff members) holding campaign signs. These individuals were also handing out tote bags that had the County logo on them and were paid for with County funds. Further, Attachment B is a campaign e-mail sent out by Cortese's campaign that refers recipients of his campaign e-mail to his County phone number and e-mail. By placing his County e-mail and phone number on his campaign communication, Cortese used County resources to respond to any campaign inquiries that were sent by recipients of the campaign communications. Cortese must be compelled to report these in-kind contributions on his next required campaign disclosure reports.

Cortese's campaign is also distributing e-mail campaign solicitations without the required advertisement disclosure. Attachment B is an e-mail sent out by the Cortese Senate campaign

that does not contain the required "Paid for By" disclosure. Attachment C is a news article that contains a picture of a campaign e-mail sent out by Cortese that also does not have required advertisement disclosure. I believe that there are numerous other e-mails sent by the Cortese campaign that also fail to provide proper advertisement disclosure that could be discovered by the FPPC through its investigative powers.
