



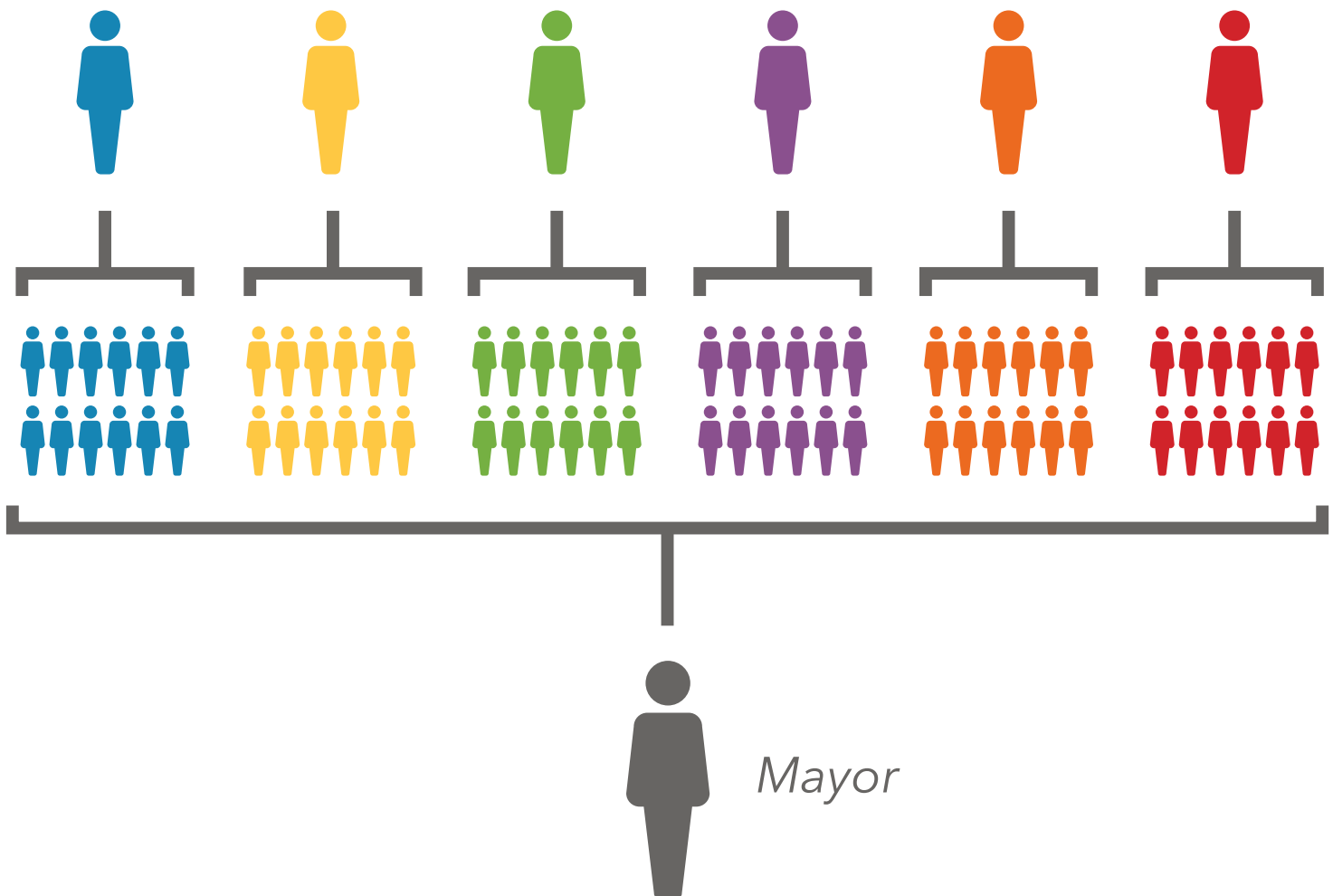

INFORMATION ABOUT LOCAL MEASURE B

Sunnyvale Will Vote March 3 on a District-Based Council Election System

Measure B would amend the City Charter to change Sunnyvale's City Council election system to six districts with a mayor directly elected by Sunnyvale voters. The current system has seven "at-large" Council seats and councilmembers select the mayor. If Sunnyvale voters pass Measure B:



You would vote for a councilmember from the district where you live.



You would vote directly for mayor every four years.



Individuals could serve up to three terms on the City Council, but no more than two terms as mayor or two terms as councilmember.



The district election system would help protect the City against a potentially costly California Voting Rights Act (CVRA) lawsuit.
